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Course Outline & Syllabus

General Music is a class designed to teach students some basic music skills that will enhance their future as both a performer as well as an educated consumer of music. The class is meant to be hands on as much as possible, i.e. learning about rhythm by playing the drums, learning about pitch by playing the piano, etc.

The course is divided into four units as follows:

- I. Rhythm Reading Skills
- II. Pitch Reading Skills
- III. Band Instrument Exposure
- IV. Music Technology

- 20% Quizzes, Classwork, & Homework
- 20% Class Participation & Effort
- 20% Final Exam
- 10% Recital Participation
- 5% Concert Attendance

Class Participation Rubric

- enters the room quietly and goes to his assigned seat.
- sets up his own music folder and instrument without delay.
- waits for instructions and prepares for class both mentally and physically.

- listens while the teacher is speaking and does not practice or play.
- follows directions quickly without questioning or arguing.
- is polite and respectful of other students during class.
- cleans his area before leaving and picks up any trash, whether or not it's his.
- collects all his personal materials at the end of class.
- returns his music folder to the appropriate area.
- returns his chair and music stand to the correct position.
- returns his instrument to correct area of storage room.

FAQ

1. **Why is an A equal to 95% instead of 100%?** Nobody is perfect.

2. **Are there plus or minus grades?** Yes, this either adds or subtracts 3 points.

For example, a B+ = 89% and an A- = 92%

3. **How do alert slips affect my class participation grade?** An alert slip related to class participation lowers your grade by 3%. One alert slip drops you from an A (95%) to an A- (92%).

Final Recital

At the end of the semester, students will perform in a recital to demonstrate their acquired performance skills. Participation is mandatory. The recital will take place on Tuesday, April 2 at 7:30 p.m. in the bandroom.

Concert Attendance

Each semester, the performing ensembles (wind ensemble, choir, jazz band) at SBP give a final concert. In an effort to support these ensembles, attendance at this concert by members of the General Music class is mandatory and counts for 5% of the final grade. In addition, since part of the purpose of the class is to generate interest in these ensembles, students need to see them and understand what they do. This semester's concert is Thursday, April 4th at 7:30 in the auditorium.

Extra Help

Extra help is available after school between 3:15 and 4:15, Tuesday through Thursday. Advanced notice is appreciated, because otherwise the teacher may leave the room to accomplish other tasks.

Late Work

For any written work that is not turned in on time, a student loses a full letter grade (9%) for each day the work is late. If a student is absent when the assignment is given, he will have one day after his return to complete the work before it is considered late. If a student is absent on the day the work is due, but received the assignment in advance, it must be handed in the day of his return.

Late Policy

Every third time a student is late, his OVERALL grade will be lowered by 3%.

Google Docs and Student Email

In order to receive and submit many assignments and other documents (such as this syllabus), students must have the ability to share Google Docs. This means that they must have a functioning Google email account provided by the school that they check and maintain regularly. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that this is working. Discipline:

3. If an instrument breaks, let Dr. Fletcher know immediately. Do not try to fix it yourself and do not take someone else's equipment. Make sure that you save all the parts.
4. No cell phones or other electronic devices. If a cell phone is used in class for calling, texting, or any of its other functions, it will be collected and given to Mr. Rowe as per school policy. Device charging is not permitted in class.
5. No food. It will be collected and thrown out.
